

MATHS

Children will cover place value, number bonds, partitioning, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, percentages, decimals, 12/24 hr clock, problem solving (budget a trip to Egypt).

ICT

Combining text and graphics – Explore how to manipulate text and graphics in different ways. Lead towards creating an information page on Egyptians – combining text and appropriate images.

English

Instructions – Recap features of instructions, write a set on how to make a mummy'

Newspaper reports – Learn newspaper reports features. Write newspaper reports about Egypt.

Information Texts– Study information texts, finding facts about Egypt. Then write own information texts.

Egyptian Stories – Own stories focus on description of Egyptian setting

SCIENCE

Living Things

To be able to identify a variety of habitats and explore why organisms live in different habitats

To be able to group organisms according to their characteristics
to be able to classify animals into specific groups according to their characteristics.

States of matter

Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius.
