Number and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, measurement, properties of shape, graphs and data collection, mental strategies and all multiplication tables, investigations and problem solving.

ART/DT

We will be observing Roman mosaics before creating our own mosaics to represent and area of Roman culture or life. We will also begin a virtual enterprise, where children will design their own chocolate, wrapper and advertising.

<u>RE</u>

We will focus on the Christian faith and various celebrations and festivals of all religions.

GEOGRAPHY

During our 'Chocolate' topic, we hope to wider our knowledge of Southern America where much of the chocolate trade begins, investigating climate and location alongside economics.

<u>PE</u>

Children will take part in a variety of athletic, gymnastic activities, whilst continuing learning different skills for games and sportsmanship.

Computing

We will continue to practice 'E' Safety keeping safe when using the internet, as well as the using the internet for research. We will also continue to develop word processing skills and use of computer programs.

MUSIC

We will be following our Charanga music scheme, where we will learn to play the recorder and investigate the genre of gospel.

English

Fantasy stories including myths and legends, imaginative recounts, play scripts, explanation texts, report writing, instructions; alongside weekly comprehension, handwriting, spelling, punctuation and grammar tasks.

SCIENCE
