Maths

Number and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, mental strategies and all multiplication tables, nvestigations and problem solving.

ART/DT

We will study the art of Henry VIII's court artist, Hans Holbein, and recreate some of his famous Tudor portraits. We will also begin to design a toy or automata with moving parts powered by simple electric circuits.

RE

Christianity was a popular topic in Tudor times, so we will look into Christianity; Catholicism and Protestantism, and the Bible. We will also study the Buddhist faith.

Computing

We will continue to practice 'E' Safety keeping safe when using the internet, as well as the using the internet for research. We will also develop word processing skills and use of computer programs.

English

Variety of writing opportunities, such as imaginative recounts, play scripts, explanation texts, report writing, instructions; alongside weekly comprehension, handwriting, spelling, punctuation and grammar tasks.

Year 4 **Creative Planning: Bright Sparks** Off with your head!

GEOGRAPHY

During our 'Bright Sparks' topic, we will look into the water cycle and weather including storms. We will also begin to understand how we can harness nature's power as alternative sources of energy.

Children will take part in a variety outdoor activities, whilst continuing learning different skills for games and sportsmanship.

MUSIC

We will be following our Charanga music scheme, where we will look at instruments of the Tudor period compared to now.

SCIENCE

Electricity- we will begin to understand how electricity works and design our own electric circuits.

HISTORY

'Off with your head!' will look at the Tudor dynasty in England; life as a Tudor, invasions and European connections and, of course, the Royal Tudor family; Henry VIII, his wives and children.
